# Timeline for Remote learning

## **School holidays brought forward**

School holidays are being brought forward so that they are completed within the 4-week lockdown period. Holidays will now begin from Monday 30 March to Tuesday 14 April inclusive (a reminder that the Tuesday after Easter Monday is always a closed day for schools).

**24<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> March** – Teachers will provide remote learning for students daily

**28<sup>th</sup> March- 14<sup>th</sup> April** – School holidays – Work will not be provided during this time

**15<sup>th</sup> April** – Teachers will reconnect with students and resume remote learning until notified by the Government that schools will resume face to face contact

### **Expectations**

The School and teachers will:

- Provide a platform for remote learning to occur (Seesaw and/or Google Classroom) during term time
- Provide a range of learning tasks that can be completed online on a device or screen free
- Approx. 1 hour of learning will be provided each school day
- Feedback will be given to students on a regular basis
- Updates about school closure to parents from the Principal will continue

## Expectations

The students will:

- Interact daily with the online classroom platform e.g. Seesaw, Google classroom
- Complete approx. 1 hour of learning provided by your teacher each day
- Interact with other class members on tasks where possible
- Ask teachers and whanau for help if you need it to complete tasks



# Family Whanau

## Expectations

The family will:

- Support children with daily learning tasks
- Facilitate learning at home. This does not mean you are the teacher but you can engage and motivate your child to learn.
- Ask teachers for help if you require assistance with tasks
- Contact the school if you require assistance with devices and remote learning
